C. Course Description and Objectives

1. Course Description

This is a clinical course during the 4th year. This course consists of didactic and clinical components. The didactic component covers theoretical aspects of odontogenic infections, maxillary sinus, endodontic surgery, maxillofacial trauma, biopsy, various methods of management of jaw lesions, and sedation and dental practice.

2. Course Main Objective

The main purpose of this course is to demonstrate knowledge of basic subjects in oral and maxillofacial surgery. And build their clinical skills in basic management of patients in oral surgery settings, including administering local anesthesia and performing simple dental extraction.

3. Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students should be able to:

- Discuss the assessment, therapeutic principles, and surgical interventions of odontogenic infections and facial trauma.
- Discuss the pathology of maxillary sinus and its clinical significance to oral surgery procedures.
- Outline the principles and techniques for managing impacted teeth, endodontic surgery, oral biopsies, and treatment of cysts and jaw tumors.
- Describe the methods used for anxiety control in dental practice.
- Utilize patient medical history to adapt treatment plans to ensure safe and effective care.
- Perform appropriate local anesthesia techniques effectively.
- Execute non-surgical extraction techniques for erupted teeth adequately.
- Demonstrate ethics and professionalism in dental practice.
